Veterans and eligible spouses receive priority in these and other programs.

WorkSource employment services

Employment services include job referrals, employment counseling, job search workshops and referrals to training programs. Employment services are available to all individuals eligible to work in the United States.

Training programs

WorkSource refers veterans and eligible spouses to specialized training programs. If approved, training in an in-demand occupation may be available. Low-income adults may qualify. Active-duty members who separate from service are often considered dislocated workers and may qualify for specialized help.

WorkSource priority service for veterans

You are eligible for priority service if:

- You served at least one day of active duty not in training and left without a dishonorable discharge. These terms include Reserve and National Guard members activated under Title 10.
- You are the spouse of a U.S. military veteran who:
 - Died as the result of a service-related disability; or
 - Is reported as missing in action or a prisoner of war; or
 - Has been forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by a foreign government or power for more than 90 days; or
 - Has a total, permanent disability resulting from military service.



Hilton Honors Military Program

The Hilton Honors Military Program gives back. Veterans, transitioning service members, and military spouses can receive a lifetime limit of 100,000 points to stay at Hilton hotels when they travel for approved job search activities.
